In Victoria, a person must not smoke or use e-cigarettes on educational premises or within 4 metres of any pedestrian access point to school premises.

Inhaling vapour from an e-

include the use of an e-cigarette.

-cigarette, the user inhales and

exhales the vapour, which can look similar to smoking a cigarette. The prohibition on smoking includes the use of e-cigarettes (vaping) and applies whether or not the e-cigarette contains nicotine.

Ogarettes and e-cigarettes cannot be sold to people under 18 years of age.

It is a legislative requirement that Keysborough Secondary College No Smoking all pedestrian access points (entrances) to the College grounds. The legislation defines smoking to

In Victoria, a person must not smoke in a motor vehicle if a person under 18 years is also present in the motor vehicle.

Smoking and vaping are also not permitted during Keysborough Secondary College events and excursions held off the College premises.

Lung cancer is the leading cause of cancer death worldwide with most cases attributed to smoking. Two of every three deaths in current long-term smokers can be attributed directly to smoking.

Smoking causes an estimated 20% of the nation's cancer disease burden each year and smoking is the biggest preventable cause of cancer.
